

Visit to Computex, Taipei- May 2011

During my period of internship I got a chance to visit - COMPUTEX Taipei. Organized by the Taiwan External Trade Development Council(TAITRA) and the Taipei Computer Association(TCA) this five day exhibition spread over 5 venues all around the city with almost 1800 companies participating and about 5300 booths, attracting about 40,000 international buyers from about 180 countries and over 500 international journalists and media covering this event is the second largest ICT trade show in the world. In 2011 COMPUTEX was held from 31st May to the 4th of June.
